- CHAMPs implemented a 7-week mandatory clinic pause, (Unable to keep clinic space safe for providers or patients).
- Dangerous travel inside Port au Prince to intercept shipped meds is proving a challenge

TODAY: THE NEED FOR a CHAMPs Clinic is higher than ever!
CHAMPs Haitian doctors report a “solid migration pattern” of families leaving the capital in search of shelter and healthcare in mountain villages near Trianon

CREDIT goes to the Haitian staff – THE BEST front-line providers to recognize disease inherent to their culture and demographics.

- **6 out of 10 Haiti hospitals are closed:** (Most within the Port au Prince region)
Escalating violence / gang control is creating supply access and staffing challenges.
“Children are being deprived of critical health supplies and meds” (UNICEF May '24)
- Non-profits (health-focused) who depend on state-side staff have either reduced services or are forced to stop.
(**Doctors without Borders** operations have been **severely disrupted**) 5/24

2024 Clinic Improvements:

- **3 Ultrasound Machines for medical clinic**
- **Diagnostic test kits**
(Pregnancy, urine, glucometer strips)
- **Consistent and safe shipping Channel:**
Air transports fly directly to a mountain air strip to avoid capital unrest

2025 Requests:

Portable Dental X-Ray Machine with sensor

Price: \$3500
(Not part of the \$30,260 budget)

The board communicates through WHATSAPP; sometimes several times a week. With each of their updates, I am in awe at their persistence. In August, Dr. Vania delivered a 3rd child of her own. Her husband, also an MD, covered clinic days so there would be no interruption of service.

Help us sustain staff **stipends** through continuity of care; plus offer **medicines** and **safe shipping** year-round.
